For some years around 1920, Munch had a dispute going with his neighbour Gunnerud, whose watchdog had a rather broad idea of where the boundaries of his master's property ran. This fierce dog - as Munch saw him - became the object of a large number of rather exaggerated drawings and lithographs.
